Run by the Student Radio Society of UBC, CiTR is a campus-based, student-driven community radio station, with a small staff and over 450+ volunteers. CiTR offers alternative coverage of every genre and perspective, with a mandate to support niche programming, local and Canadian artists and underrepresented voices. Each week, 100+ locally produced programs are broadcast on 101.9fm in seven different languages, with live streaming and podcasts at citr.ca.

The Access Collective Coordinator will be responsible for leading a team of volunteer to produce written and broadcast content focusing on the issues and voices of the those that identify as having a disability(visible or invisible) on campus.

TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Facilitating the creation of broadcast content on accessibility issues, sharing the news and voices of those affected on campus. This would include reaching out to UBC groups, faculties, departments and off campus groups and organizations for interviews and show topics
- Facilitating the creation of written content for CiTR and Discorder's website <u>www.citr.ca</u>
- Outreach and recruitment to form the collective, including reaching out to campus groups, working with CiTR staff to create and disseminate promotional materials
- Assisting with the training of new CiTR members
- Developing a structure for collectively-created programming and content
- Organizing workshops for the Lower Mainland community addressing issues and developing skills pertinent to the collective

The ideal candidate will be motivated, creative and organized, have demonstrated commitment to accessibility and equity issues. Experience and involvement with students groups or community organizations is an asset. The candidate will have experience or interest in broadcasting, journalism, research and interviewing, training and working with volunteers. - Training CiTR volunteers to use our digital editing software and involving volunteers in the production of ads and on-air promos
- Assist with the maintenance of CiTR's studio equipment

Strong writing and communication skills are necessary for the position, as well as basic knowledge of sound editing and some experience with training others. - Coordinate, manage and train a team of volunteer sports broadcasters to produce sports broadcasts and special programming
- Liaise with CiTR staff and UBC Athletics staff to coordinate logistics for broadcasts and interviews
- Promote CiTR's sports broadcasts at Thunderbird games, on-air, on social media and on the CiTR website

JOB REQUIREMENTS

The ideal candidate will be motivated, organized, and detail-oriented, with great problem solving skills and a passion for sport. They will have skills, experience or interest in broadcasting, sound editing, live sound, sports and/or journalism. Proven ability to work with diverse communities of students is an asset.
