

YEAR AT A GLANCE

In the winter of 2011, a AMS referendum passed increasing CiTR's funding from \$4 to \$5 per student, passing by 1%.

This caused us to re-examine our service to the student population of UBC, and make student engagement our top priority. We hired a Volunteer Manager to develop a volunteer program, rethought our training program, questioned our accessibility and fleshed out each department.

Over the 2011-2012 year, we increased our membership to 330 members (a 35% improvement), increased the percentage of student members by 15% and doubled the number of student programmers on-air.

Involving more students has had an amazing impact on every department and brought new vitality to our program grid.

APRIL

BLOCK PARTY

CiTR 101.9 FM broadcast live from the AMS Block Party on April 5, 2012, participating in this annual celebration of the beginning of summer and the end of the academic year.

RECORD STORE DAY

CiTR and CJSF teamed up on April 21st for Record Store, live broadcasting from noon to 7 pm at record stores across the city. CiTR was live on location at Beat Street, Vinyl, Scratch, and Zulu records, leap-frogging to CJSF for Red Cat and Neptoon. Interviews and live performances featured Ladyhawk, Apollo Ghosts, Vicious Cycles, Damien Jurado and Vancouver djs.

JUNE

2011 NORTH AMERICAN OUTGAMES

CiTR was awarded a grant from the Community Radio Fund of Canada to provide extensive coverage of the 2011 North American Outgames. Our team of nine broadcasters produced 19 live onlocation broadcasts and over 37 hours of original programming in one week, covering sport events, the Human Rights Conference, cultural events and Pride celebrations that accompanied the games. Seven queer youth from QMUNITY's GAB program were selected and trained to join the team of on-location broadcasters. The coverage ended with a party: a live broadcast float from CiTR, QueerFM, and the QMUNITY GAB Youth program in the 2011 Vancouver Pride Parade.

SEPTEMBER

PRESIDENT'S TOWN HALL

Each year the President's Town Hall brings UBC faculty, staff and students together for an interactive dialogue. This year, Peter Klein, Acting Director and Professor, Graduate School of Journalism joined Prof. Stephen J. Toope for a thought-provoking interview on September 9, 2011, aired on CiTR.

VICTORY SQUARE BLOCK PARTY

If Music Waste welcomes the start of summer in Vancouver, then the Victory Square Block Party on September 4 is the ultimate way to say good-bye. An afternoon of fundraising, bands, comedy, nature, random sprinkler attacks and music in an historic setting with all your friends... and CiTR was there broadcasting and interviewing!

NOVEMBER

DAVID SUZUKI AT THE CHAN CENTRE

CiTR recorded and re-broadcast this lecture on Thursday, November 10th, from 5-6pm, and Thursday, November 17th, from 10-11am.

NCRA RECLAIM YOUR RADIO

On Monday, November 14, campus and community radio stations across Canada combined efforts to produce a special day-long broadcast celebrating the 25th anniversary of the National Campus and Community Radio Association (NCRA). This broadcast launched Reclaim your Radio, a NCRA-led campaign to reserve frequencies for campus and community radio stations.
