

CiTR Volunteer Position: Persons of Colour Collective Coordinator

CiTR 101.9 FM is the broadcasting voice of UBC Vancouver, situated on the unceded, traditional Coast Salish territory of the Həndəminəm speaking Musqueam peoples. CiTR began as a student club in 1937, gaining not-for-profit status and a place on the FM dial in 1982. Run by the Student Radio Society of UBC, CiTR is a campus-based community radio station, student-driven while serving the larger community. Since 1983, CiTR has also published *Discorder Magazine*, a locally-focused magazine that covers arts, culture and current affairs.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Persons of Colour Collective Coordinator will coordinate a group of volunteers to produce a biweekly radio show that increases the representation of BIPOC communities, stories, and perspectives in the media landscape at both UBC and in the Lower Mainland. This involves communicating with interested programmers and volunteers, preparing a show, training and supporting new volunteers, and communicating with relevant station staff on the progress and needs of the collective.

TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Facilitate and/or host the production of a biweekly radio show to be broadcast on 101.9FM with the support and engagement of interested collective members.
- Maintain email account (poccollective@citr.ca) for updates on events and interview offers
- Send out monthly callouts to volunteers to recruit collective members.
- Stay in contact with CiTR Spoken Word, Programming, and Volunteer Managers to stay up to ensure you and your volunteers are supported in training, production, hosting, etc.

COMMITMENT

• Approximately 5-7 hours every other week, more if desired.
